# PREFACE

Efforts toward publication of this volume of papers presented to the 1947 through 1952 annual conferences of the Southeastern Association of Game and Fish Commissioners were initiated during a conversation between Joe L. Herring of Lousiana and Ed Hill of Alabama at the annual conference in Hot Springs, AR, in 1979. Mr. Herring inquired as to the availability of copies of the papers in the library of the Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit at Auburn University. A suggestion was made that the Auburn University student chapter of the Wildlife Society attempt to compile both fisheries and wildlife papers as a chapter project. The student chapter responded to the request and searched for copies of papers on file. Several papers were in the library, and for some years, 1952 for example, all the wildlife papers presented, and a conference program had been collected in a bound folder and were available. With these papers, those in Herring's personal collection, and about eight that were obtained from individuals over the next four years, all but one wildlife paper were assembled.

Directors of state agencies, fisheries biologists that were working in the early 1950s, and three presidents of the Southern Section of the American Fisheries Society were also subsequently contacted and most fisheries papers were assembled. A decision was made by the Southeastern Directors at the fall meeting 1982 to end efforts to collect papers after March 1983 and publish those on hand.

Tim Fendley, Clemson University, was contacted and agreed to serve as editor to publish the volume.
